
Conrad Spirit of Innovation Challenge

The Conrad Spirit of Innovation Challenge encourages high school students like ourselves to combine entrepreneurship and STEM skills to develop innovative ideas for a sustainable and brighter future. We initially demonstrated an interest in the competition over a year ago and have been working ever since to develop an innovative product that helps solve a real-world problem. We are one of the international semi-finalists of the competition.

In order to expand our research and business marketing skills, we began to explore the different categories that the Conrad Challenge offers: space and aviation, cybertechnology and security, energy and environment, and health and nutrition. After months of research about the problem identified in each category and its competitive markets, we decided to focus on energy and environment. The lack of availability of clean, drinkable water for people in third world countries inspired the creation of RollX, a cylindrical water container which filters water as a user walks.

RollX converts rotational motion of the wheels to linear motion, moving a plate which pressurizes contaminated water through filtration, producing clean water. Our vision of RollX began from a scratch drawing on a whiteboard to an Illustrator drawing to a detailed design on Solidworks. We were captivated by this design process and were committed to take RollX one step further into production. Partnering with mechanical team members, we successfully developed a small-scale prototype of the key mechanism used in RollX.



The Conrad Challenge not only allowed us to improve our knowledge of the research and designing processes, we were also able to expand our business marketing skills.

The app aimed to provide people with any unsettling questions such as where they can find hospitals, proper procedures when giving first aid, and any information regarding natural disasters for the people who are ill-informed. The third team had new members Erika Galvan, Samantha Gonzalez, and Christine Castrellon create, *Rise up*, an app designed for protesters. *Rise Up* serves as a resource for people of all ages to access information on upcoming protests, rallies, and town hall events to become activists in their community. Each team worked diligently and will prepare for next year's groups to keep the legacy of Los Altos Academy of Engineering present in the challenge.


